Lessons: Hosea 13: 4 – 14; Luke 7: 11 – 17

Thanksgiving, eucharist, is the very name of this sacrament, and it is the occasion appointed by God himself for us to offer our thanksgivings to him at all times. The only perfect thanksgiving ever made is the thanksgiving of the Son of God to his Eternal Father, and so thankful he is, that he finds the giving of his whole being continually to his Father not too much for the expression of his thanks. And when he came amongst us for our salvation, his thankoffering to the Father embraced not only his life, but his voluntary death. On the night before he died he gave us this sacrament and he gave it under the form of thanksgiving, adapting to his purpose the common Jewish thanksgivings for food and drink. We give thanks in his eucharist for all the bread of God; for food, for the nourishment of mind and soul – and has not God given us such a mind that it is fed with all his wondrous works, and such a soul as to feed on Jesus Christ, Man and God?

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music** by **number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.
